Spring 2009: Central Oaks & Prairies and East Texas Pineywoods

This report is reduced from 2414 sightings of 280 species from 1 March to 31 May 2009.

WEATHER REPORTS:

Brush Freeman, Bastrop Co., 12 March, "I returned to Utley for a few days and between yesterday and today so far have received 1.17" of rain, the biggest rain event since August 2008 here. It will take a lot more but am pleased with what fell."

MOST UNUSUAL SIGHTINGS:

Higher counts and more reports of **Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks** continue from East Texas, including 40 at Lake Palestine in *Smith* 12 Mar (Joe Marsey), a nesting pair at Lake Bob Sandlin, *Camp*, in April (Jack Ainsworth) and other sightings in *Grimes, Wood* and *Henderson* (fide Peter Barnes).

A Least Grebe found in Round Rock 2 Mar (Tim Fennell) is a first for *Williamson*; another (the same?) was reported in Round Rock 23 Apr (fide Eric Carpenter).

Now a rarity for East Texas, a **Northern Bobwhite** heard in *Gregg* 16 Apr (Peter Barnes) is noteworthy.

Remarkably, 23 **Brown Pelicans** still resided at Lake Livingston spillway, *Polk-San Jacinto*, 16 Mar (David Wolf, Robert Truss), two were at Lake Somerville, *Washington*, on 21 Apr (Darrell Fischer), presumably holdouts from last year's hurricanes, and an immature was at Granger Lake, *Williamson*, 2 May (Tim Fennell, Byron Stone) and yet another pelican was at Lake Waco, *McLennan*, 3 May (Eric Haskell).

A **Glossy Ibis** 8-10 May (Tim Fennell) at Richland Creek WMA, *Freestone*, is rare.

Purple Gallinules made a good showing this spring at inland sites, including single sightings at Gus Engling WMA in *Anderson* 27 Apr (Tal Roberts), Country Club Lake in *Brazos* 28 Apr (Keith Arnold, et al.) and Austin, *Travis*, 18-20 May (Desha Melton, et al.)

A **Common Moorhen** at Waco Wetlands in *McLennan* 3-17 May (Eric Haskell) is a rare find. Somewhat more frequent, although not annual, are three at Country Club Lake, *Brazos*, 19-26 May (Keith Arnold) and one at Hornsby Bend, *Travis*, 21 May (Rob Fergus).

A "fallout" of **American Golden-Plovers** occurred in mid March at inland sites. On 11 Mar (David Wolf), 95 were counted at Angelina County Airport and 65 at Lake Sam Rayburn TX 147 bridge, *San Augustine*. The next day, 19 were at Nacogdoches Airport, *Nacogdoches*, and still one was there on the 13 Mar. Hundreds of golden-plovers were at the turf farms in *Burleson* on 15 Mar (David Scott).

A sizable flock of 36 **Willets** were apparently driven by a storm to Airport Beach Park on Lake Waco, *McLennan*, 3 May (Eric Haskell) and 14 were still there 16 May.

Not reported annually, 2 **Ruddy Turnstones** were at Lake Waco, *McLennan*, on 16 May (Eric Haskell), and curiously this Airport Beach Park location is the same where they were reported last in 2004.

Dunlins were reported at Richland Creek WMA, *Freestone*, on 8 May (Tim Fennell) and at Lake Waco, *McLennan*, on 16 May (Eric Haskell).

A count of 258 **Wilson's Phalaropes** at Richland Creek WMA, *Freestone*, 8 May (Tim Fennell) is impressive.

Up to 5 **Short-eared Owls** wintered in *McLennan* and were last reported 3 Mar (Karen Arquette, Eric Haskel, et al.).

Rare for the Central Brazos Valley, a **Black-chinned Hummingbird** visited feeders in *Brazos* on 14 Apr (Sandy Dillard).

A wintering **Rufous Hummingbird** remained in *Nacogdoches*, until 1 Mar (Jack Rohrer).

A brief look at a possible **Tropical/Couch's Kingbird**, identified by the absence of white outer tail feathers, was reported at Lake Tyler, *Smith*, 23 Apr (Elizabeth Farley, Jamie Cantrell, Jessica Coleman). There are no records for Western Kingbird in *Smith*, and this sighting would be a first record for Tropical/Couch's.

Two **Cave Swallows** in *Anderson* 7 Mar (Peter Barnes, Mike Dillon) is a first county record.

A **Sprague's Pipit** was observed at the late date of 3 May (Randy Pinkston) in Temple, *Bell*.

A new record for *Freestone* is a **Palm Warbler** at Richland Creek WMA 19 Apr (Peter Barnes, Dale Ohl, Lynette & Jim Jackson).

Adding to only a few *McLennan* records, a **Prothonotary Warbler** was observed 17 May (Eric Haskell) at Flat Rock Park on Lake Waco.

A first county record for *Austin*, a **Swainson's Warbler** nested in wooded back yard. The nest, 4 ft. off the ground, was discovered 3 May (Sue Ruotsala, Billie Bernard) when brush was cleared for some plantings, unfortunately removing some of the cover hiding the nest with 5 eggs, including one cowbird egg. By 5 May the bird had removed the cowbird egg. On 13 May the bird and all eggs were gone.

East of its normal range, a singing male **Spotted Towhee** was in Nacogdoches 17 March (Robert Truss).

An unusually large number of reports of migrating **Clay-colored Sparrows** came from counties where they are not often reported, including *Brazos*, *Freestone*, *Gregg*, *McLennan*, and *Smith*.

A first county record for *Austin* and one of only a few spring records for the surrounding area, a female **Black-headed Grosbeak** was photographed 17 April (Sue Ruotsala, Billie Bernard).

Lazuli Buntings passed through Central Texas, including 5 at one residence in western *Bastrop* (fide Eric Carpenter). More surprisingly, out-of-range single Lazuli Buntings appeared in *Robertson* 11 Apr (Patricia Stovall), a first county record, as well as *Smith* on 29 Apr (Mike Bloodsworth) and *Van Zandt* on 29 Apr (Dale Ohl).

A surprising number of inland sightings of **Bobolinks** occurred in mid May, including 8 males on 3 May (Roy Smallwood, Eric Haskell) near Waco Airport in *McLennan*, 1 male 4 May (Dennis Shepler) in *Waller*, a first county record, up to 60 in southern *Brazos* 4-10 May (ph. Toby Hibbitts, m.ob.), and 2 males 6 May (ph. Rich Kostecke) at Cowhouse Creek arm of Belton Lake in *Bell*.

A rare migrant for East Texas, a **Yellow-headed Blackbird** was at Camp Tyler in *Smith* on 30 Apr (Peter Barnes).

Seventy Rusty Blackbirds were at Tyler in *Smith* 12 Mar (Peter Barnes) while 10 were extremely late at Richland Creek WMA in *Freestone* on 19 Apr (Peter Barnes, Dale Ohl, Lynette & Jim Jackson).

Purple Finches were almost lacking this past winter and the only spring report was 2 in *Angelina* 12 Mar (Jimmie Putnam).

Abundant numbers of wintering **Pine Siskins** tarried into spring in Central and East Texas (e.g., *Coryell, McLennan, Brazos, Washington, Smith*) with the last report being one flyover in *Bastrop* 12 May (Brush Freeman).
